


FORT NAPOLEON

COLLECTIONS OF THE PROVINCE OF WEST-FLANDERS AND THE CITY OF OSTEND



So you think you have seen, visited and experienced everything? Well, you could very well be wrong.



FLORAL CLOCK 0

No idea what the time is? The 20,000 flowers and plants of the floral clock in the Leopold Park will tell you.

DIKKE MATHILLE (BIG MATILDA) 2

The real name of this bronze nude from 1954 is 'The Sea', but there is not one person in Ostend who calls it that.

SAINT PETER- & PAUL'S CHURCH 1

Neo-gothic church with beautiful stained glass windows, completed in 1907. Behind the altar is the mausoleum of Queen Louise-Marie, first Queen of Belgium.

THE ROYAL GALLERIES 4

Built in 1905 to protect the well-to-do citizens from the sun and rain. However, you may use them as well.

THE VENETIAN GALLERIES (5)

Built by Leopold II and still owned by the "Koninklijke Schenking" institution. The statue of King Boudewijn I keeps an eye on things.

THE 'DRIE GAPERS' (1)

High above the endless stream of strolling people, Leopold II looks out over the sea. The three passages through to the city are called 'gapers'.

OUR LADY OF THE DUNES CHURCH IN RAVERSIJDE 7

James Ensor is buried in the shade of this beautiful church built in the 14th century.



JAPANESE GARDEN

The Far East is so close. You will feel peaceful in this beautifully landscaped garden in Kaiyusschikistyle, and you will come to your senses. *Zen!*






















OSTEND FROM THE SEA

In July and August the *Franlis* departs from the Western Pier every hour. The *Seastar* sails daily from Ostend to Nieuwpoort and back. By visiting Ostend you have come to THE RIGHT PLACE

You are staying in Ostend, the only real city by the sea. This means that besides fun in the water and on the beach, there are many more activities. For young and old, for men and women, for short stays or for longer ones.

Especially for you, we have roamed the town. From left to right and from north to south, in search of hidden places and places that are more easily accessible.



Our starting point is the *Monacoplein* at the entrance to the city's In&Uit-office. In the well-appointed reception area our friendly staff will gladly answer any questions you might have. They can also provide you with city maps, a walking or cycling guide, or a less well-thumbed copy of this magazine. The ultimate Ostend souvenir is also available at a minimum cost.

The trip we describe on this page and the following pages will provide you with a wide range of experiences and impulses. Should you have a glass in every outdoor cafe, buy something in every shop and have something to eat in each restaurant, you will not survive the walk. So a good balance is paramount. Just return to us often!

The Casino Kursaal was completely renovated and now, is once again the landmark it should always have been. Inside you can enjoy a drink or a delectable piece of freshly baked cake in the Coffee House - if the weather is good, you would naturally choose to be outside on the terrace with its unique sea view. The Ostend Queen offers the same view. It is the top-floor restaurant, which offers you a menu inspired by star chef Pierre Wynants.

If it is still too early for a multi-course meal, why not book a table now before we join you on this extensive walking tour.

If ever there was one notorious street in Flanders, it would be the Langestraat (it begins on the right of the In&Uit-office). Today - or rather tonight - you can indulge in some serious night life, but there is no need to worry. On the contrary: choose any outdoor cafe, and you will be guaranteed premium seating for a great relaxing half hour of 'people watching', one of our favourite pastimes.







THE LANGESTRAAT

The *Langestraat* is uh... the longest street in the centre. It crosses about ten other (shopping) streets, but for once, we will keep to the straight and narrow and walk all the way to the seafront (Albert I-promenade). However, we will need to make some necessary stops on the way.

For instance, at the multi-coloured, crazy, charming objects outside White Interiors (no. 55). Do take some time to wander among the vintage furniture designs from the 50s and 60s, and be charmed by a dented scooter or finally buy the lamp you have been dreaming of for years.

Equally charming is the **Koekoek** (38-40), a restaurant that has only one dish on its menu: chicken from the spit. You are allowed to use your fingers, or rather; you have to, because cutlery is not included in the price. Indulge yourself and let the fat drip down your chin, seven days a week, 24 hours a day!

Also in (what's in a name) Stad Kortrijk (119), table manners are not a high priority. The fresh sea sole has a far-reaching reputation, that goes even beyond the city the restaurant is named after. Just like the eccentric manager, by the way.

If you like things to be a bit more trendy then Bar Tao (24-26) is the place for you. Enjoy a cocktail in the bar or outdoors in the afternoon, and in the evening select an exotic dish from the Tao world cuisine. During the weekend the best DJs of the moment play their dance music.



The various music cafes in the Langestraat are also fully up-to-date. La Favette (12) combines soul and chanson with a great jazzy atmosphere. The neighbours of Bordel Musical (10) make you dream of (even more) exotic places with their fresh fruit juices and cool cocktails and the same goes for Le Dôme (15) where you can spend an evening of sensual entertainment. If your musical taste leans toward the alternative, find your way to the Twilight (21) and the Manuscript (23). Five top places in one location!

And there is more. When you step into Celtic Ireland (67), it is as if you have entered a different world; if you walk past a beautiful stairwell with an impressive chandelier, you will find yourself in the cafe. When you leave you will enjoy the immense outdoor area with its impressive murals. If you had planned on having only one Guinness in your lifetime, let it be here.

And still we have not finished. Don't forget; this is the Langestraat! On the corner of the Kapucijnenstraat no less than three cafes are vying for your patronage: Tati's Jazz Club (apparently the place to be), Harry's Place and The Cosy Corner.

If that is not enough, Ostend's most famous cafe is just around the corner. In the magnificent art-deco interior of den Artiest (Kapucijnenstraat 13) you can enjoy a grill which is prepared right before your eyes on the blazing charcoal. A wonderful feeling of peace permeates your body, here you can relax completely...



KAPELLESTRAAT

Recently the *Kapellestraat* was voted best shopping street in Flanders by the Belgian newspaper Het Nieuwsblad. Among its main attractions are the huge offer and the remarkable fact that many shops here (and in the rest of Ostend) are open on Sundays. The fact that with every purchase you get the healthy sea air for free is of course an added bonus.

CHRISTINASTRAAT

Parallel to the Kapellestraat is the *Christinastraat*. Chocolatier Yperman (31) works like a magnet. The variety of delicacies under one roof is breathtaking.

From one sweet sin to the other is but a small step in Ostend. In the wonderfully atmospheric **Lust for Life** (56) women will find everything they need to please their partners and (of course) share the enjoyment.

Because the way to a man's heart is through his stomach, **ToppJect** (60) seems a good place for a break. From stylish cookware to a state-of-the-art kitchen robot, or espresso-machine, you will find everything here for good-looking cooking.

If you have not bought your fill of toys yet, you can surprise your faithful pets with a trinket or a small present from the **Whoepy Woef** (49) dog boutique.









WITTENONNENSTRAAT

By this time any gentleman of standing will find himself in **Jacqueloot**'s hat shop (29A). James Ensor used to buy all his hats here. If you are looking for a *Stetson*, *Panama* or *Bogart*, you have come to the right address, but Andy Cap is most welcome here too, and that goes for *Flo* as well.

From one classic shop to the other: Kaas Haspeslagh (29) does not remove its cheese from the maturing area until it is perfect. With a variety of over 400 different cheeses, an artisan butchery and low-fat diet cheeses, you will know which side of your bread is buttered tonight.

Food for the mind is available at Corman's Bookshop (38), where books are still treated with love and respect. Tip: enjoy the smell and the crisp freshness of your new novel or reference while you have a delicious slice of cake in Fee d'Hiver's (16b) beautiful white interior. The salads look great too.

If you prefer a glass of wine, proceed a few more meters. In wine bistro diVino (2) you will feel as if you are living the life of Riley or dio in Tuscany. Salute! More Italian delight: Via La Tavola (12-14), where homemade pasta or pizza will delight your taste buds. This should be called Viva La Tavola!









MORE STREETS AND SQUARES

And so we wander on to and around the square Wapenplein.

We come to the conclusion that La Provence (Nieuwstraat 13) is barely 50 metres from Italy (Pomodoro, Groentenmarkt 5). On the same Groentenmarkt Soep.kom is the winner. The prize is awarded for the most original name and the best soup in Ostend.

Fats Domino invites us to the (very cosy) pub with the same name in the Kerkstraat and at the Kursaal's Westhelling the Lounge Bar Kursaal provides the (very trendy) counterpart. Later on we enjoy the delicious food and the original church floor in La Galleria (James Ensorgaanderij 30).







We still have 't Zeezotje (Bonenstraat 17) to go to and the Mosselbeurs (Dwarsstraat 10), but we cannot seem to get past the inviting open window of d'Oede Tiet (Dwarsstraat 8). Plus we also want some art (Benoot Gallery, Koningstraat 20) and 20th century design (Vorm, Hertstraat 9). Aaaargh!

GASTRONOMY

While you are enjoying a great night's sleep in your hotel or apartment, the fishermen are casting their nets at sea. Last night's catch is tomorrow's dinner. Even more fresh is just not possible. You can just taste it.

Fish takes up a prominent part on the menus of Ostend's restaurants. Like shrimp, mussels, lobster, oysters and other seafood. However, meat, poultry or vegetarian food is usually also available.

The *Restozine* provides you with an exquisite selection of restaurants that all have at least one thing in common: quality.

To make your mouth water: the following pages contain a surprising four-course meal.

VISTRAP (FISH MARKET)

Preparing your own fish is another possibility. At the Vistrap you can make your selection from a staggering variety of freshly caught North Sea fish. This is rather more special than you might think, because the Vistrap is the only fish market that welcomes private customers! From 7 am.

Do you feel like an original and delicious snack? Buy a serving of "wulloks" (whelks) or warm escargots Ostend style at one of the many stalls on the Visserskaai.







FOUR LEAF CLOVER

Four passionate restaurateurs and their chefs each present one of the best listings on their menu. Together they have created a finger licking four-course menu.



THE STARTER • BOTTARGA

Restaurateur Gerald Piers has barely hit thirty, but he has seen a large part of the (culinary) world. His menu reflects this; he brings together top-notch world cuisine and his Ostend roots. The restaurant's atmosphere is trendy and modern, but simultaneously warm and inviting. A great combination.

FRESH SEAFOOD SASHIMI

The pieces of raw salmon, tuna, butterfish and scallop are arranged on a pretty wooden board and vie for our attention. We mix the soy sauce and wasabi to our own taste; pieces of ginger complete the tasty picture.

Of course we would like to order a white wine; however, chef Miguel Brouns advises a fresh red South African Graham Beck Pinno Pinotage. And, as usual, the chef is more than right: it is a perfect match!

Bottarga Albert I Promenade 64 / T. + 32/59.80.86.88

The restaurant gets its name from the bottarga, a Sardinian specialty. They are tuna or swordfish eggs, still in roe. They are pickled and preserved in candlewax.

Because the - very salty - caviar was not an immediate success among Ostend diners, bottarga is no longer on the menu.





THE MAIN COURSE • FISH • LE GRILLON

Everything about Le Grillon exudes quality: the interior, the service, and first and foremost: classical French cuisine. Far from any trends, three experienced chefs prepare the dishes that are on the extensive menu. Restaurateur Willy Verdonck is the quality label: for more than 40 years he has stuck to 'old- fashioned reliability'. Gastronomy and hospitality go hand in hand here.

POACHED RAY WING

Ray is a delicate fish that does not take transport very well. You will need to travel to get the best out of this delicious and easily digestible fish. To Le Grillon, for instance, where it finds its way onto

your plate straight from the sea.

A dry Chablis Fourchaume Premier Cru or a Pouilly-Fuissé Mâconnais are a great combination with the honest taste of the poached fish.

THE MAIN COURSE • MEAT • RESTAURANT AUTEUIL

Women behind the stove. According to some men, that's where they belong: we would not dare say anything like that. Fact is that Caroline and Isabelle, the two head chefs in Restaurant Auteuil, add a little je ne sais quoi to the original classic dishes. A touch of mystery, a whiff of creativity and a good dose of courage will provide a delicious adventure on your plate time and again.

STOCK DOVE SALTIMBOCCA

Flamboyant and a little eccentric: as soon as you see Isabelle entering the room, you will understand what we mean. She does not offer you a menu called 'Les Nanas have it their way' for nothing. Today it reads stock dove saltimbocca, mozzarella, and marinated swedes in pesto and pata negra, among other things.

There is chicken stock and...something she does not want to divulge. It is up to you to discover what it is!

THE DESSERT • ENOTECA DEL BEREBENE

Enoteca of the lovely drop

It is no coincidence that Enoteca del Berebene's interior is tasteful and has a great atmosphere: it was created with love by the restaurateur's wife, who is an interior designer. Indeed, love and passion are key words in this small but lovely place: the owner Thierry Hecht gave up his life in Hong Kong and followed his two great loves to Ostend: Isabelle and Italian cuisine.

An Enoteca is typically Italian.


Literally translated it means wine shop, however, usually they do not only sell wines but tastings are possible as well.


Often combined with a delicious snack.

TORTA AL FORMAGGIO

Do not even think of calling this Torta al Formaggio just plain cheese cake! The recipe is a carefully kept secret, which Chef Lamberto received from his employer in Tuscany after years of loyal service. Years before, the old Italian lady had inherited it from her father, who had created a furore with it in Tripoli, the capital of the former Italian colony Libya. The torte is *assolutamente squisito* and is finished with a home-made strawberry coulis.

As accompaniment, we drink a glass of sparkling Franciacorta, cuvée Bellavista, the Rolls Royce of Italian spumantes. If you still doubt the quality and especially the authenticity of the Italian dishes knowing that the chef's name is Lamberto Spinelli and was directly 'imported' from Bari in the far south, why not try the overly delicious burratina pugliese which is not on the menu anywhere else In Flanders.

COCKTAIL


